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From the Desk of the President

Winter 2014 – *Massive winter storms pummeling the East Coast... Record snowfall amounts... Artic air masses, subzero temperatures, the polar vortex... snow days, delayed openings, early dismissals... a state of emergency...* all part of one of the most disruptive winters in decades. Before we put this wintry season behind us, let's applaud our "essential personnel" – our custodial, maintenance and grounds members for their hard work in the district throughout this wintry season. Additionally, so many members have also expressed their gratitude to Superintendent Dr. Patirick Piegari for making the right decisions about school closures for the safety of students and for all staff of our schools.

Though weary from this parade of winter storms, our members must remain focused on the changes that continue to affect public education – teacher evaluation reform, implementation of the Common Core, the transition to online PARCC Assessments, and the threat of privatization.

First, let's focus on TEACHNJ. With the enactment of this legislation, all districts were required to implement a new teacher evaluation model that includes both measures of teacher practice and student achievement. In order to ensure the accuracy and reliability of the district's Danielson Evaluation Model, the Association requested that members send their evaluations to the EBEA office. After review of so many members' evaluations, the Association is closely monitoring the timelines of post-observation conferences (as per the NJDOE regulations) as well as the submission of the written evaluation reports to the teaching staff (as per Article XVI of the contract). The Association is also pleased to see the quality of our members' written responses to both long and short evaluations. Not only are our members responding to elements rated as *partially effective*, but they are also suggesting that ratings of *effective* be changed to *highly effective* inclusive of their comprehensive evidence shared with administrators during the post observation conferences. Truly, our certificated members continue to be actively engaged in evaluation reform as a means of measuring effectiveness and enhancing professional growth.

Next, educators have shifted their attention to the state's implementation of the Common Core Curriculum Standards (CCCS) and the transition to the Partnership for Assessments of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) testing. Many state organizations expressed concerns before the state's Assembly Education Committee about the rush and haphazard way the NJ Department of Education is imposing these changes on school districts. Assemblyman Patrick Diegnan acknowledged a strong consensus around the need to slow down these initiatives in order to get them right. New York's State Education Department is already slowing down its implementation of the Common Core and the assessments linked to evaluations. Perhaps with the departure of NJ's Commissioner Chris Cerf who leaves to become the CEO of a company who sells assessments to school districts, the next commissioner will be more open to changes in evaluations, standards and testing!

Finally, our Board of Education hired a company to conduct a comprehensive assessment of the district's food service functions and operations. Our child nutritionists became fearful of the threat of privatization and loss of jobs. After receiving the assessment of the food services program report, the Association met with the members of the child nutrition department to provide information about possible changes to be made in order to retain these ladies and gentlemen as Board employees. The Association will continue to engage in discussions with the Board to not privatize this department – not next year, not the year after, and hopefully, not ever!

As the memories of Winter 2014 are left behind, we now prepare for Spring. Remember that springtime is typically a season of renewal. Why not take the time this spring to renew your advocacy for a better and brighter future – for our students, for ourselves and for our great public schools.
