In June, the verdict of the Janus vs. AFSCME case is expected to be announced. This could have a major impact on unions across the state and nation. It is important to remember the union you belong to protects the rights and jobs of members, facilitates collective bargaining, aids in student achievement, provides career and professional development resources, keeps staff and students safe, provides liability insurance and legal representation, aids in advocacy efforts, fights against privatization, and educates and informs our membership. Being a part of strong union makes a difference.

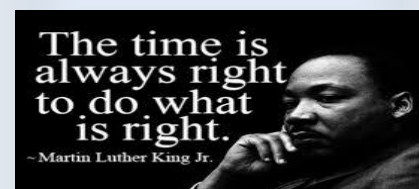
